Pam Carne read the Rotary International Club recognition of Lithuania and the Rotary Club of Valnius:

Tonight along with the national day of Lithuania celebrated on the 16th of February we recognise the Rotary club of Vilnius. It was established in 1992 and it has 54 members.

The president is Sigitas Rencys and the secretary is TADAS VILCINSKAS.

Lithuania, officially the Republic of Lithuania, is a country in the Baltic region of Europe with a population of 2.8 million people.

The Greek, Latin, German, Celtic, and the Slavic are one of the oldest languages in the World, but they are not even nearly as old as the Lithuanian tongue, which is the most ancient one from them all.

Lithuania has the oldest oak tree in Europe, called The Stelmuze Oak, which is 23 meters high, and is more than 1,500 years old. It requires 8-9 people just to hug its trunk.

Basketball is the most popular sport in Lithuania, and it is said to be the second religion of our people. Lithuania has the fourth best basketball team in the World, which has won three bronze medals at the Olympics. Lithuania has one of the fastest Internet connections in the World. It is the first country in Europe which has introduced the Local Breakout (LBO) technology, offering cheap mobile internet for travelers and allowing them to avoid big data roaming charges

President Mel introduced our guest speaker for tonight Geeth Geeganaga, a Community Ambassador for NBN

Geeth gave a very interesting and informative presentation on NBN rollout for our areas with the following points;

- NBN is a Government Business Enterprise and is solely the wholesaler, not the installer or retailer for the service
- The design, survey, inspection and connection is carried out by approved contractors
- Your NBN service is purchased by approved retailers such as Telstra, Optus and others
- People can request a phone only plan and do not have to sign up for an internet plan, but cannot keep their old landline as it is being completely phased out
- Be aware of scams such as phone calls form "Nicole". The NBN does not phone people directly but rather by mail
- Check all costs with a retail provider before signing up and also check if you can keep you existing phone
 number and email address. Also check compatibility of existing services such as back to base fire alarms,
 medical alarms and even fax machine.
- NBN runs off of the mains power and will not work during power outages
- All NBN contractors must have identification with "Enable" shown on it. If not do not allow them onto your property

Geeth's presentation was warmly received and Tess proposed a vote of thanks presenting him with the usual photo and certificate of appreciation.
